

Jesus Heals Many People

Jesus left the meeting place and went to Simon's home. When Jesus got there, he was told that Simon's mother-in-law was sick with a high fever. So Jesus went over to her and ordered the fever to go away. Right then she was able to get up and serve them a meal.

After the sun had set, people with all kinds of diseases were brought to Jesus. He put his hands on each one of them and healed them.

Ask the person who is looking after you today to let you watch a story of Jesus healing people on the computer. The link is in their email.

Craft Activities

There are videos to help you with these crafts – ask the grown up taking care of you today if you can watch them. The link is in their email.

There is a piece of plastic sheet in your pack for you to use to protect surfaces while you are making the crafts.

Simon Peter's mother-in-law is healed

You will need:

- Colouring sheet
- Scissors

- Pencil crayons
- Glue stick

Colour in Simon Peter's mother-in-law and her bed and cut them out. Cut out the four strips of paper. Lay two of them at right angles to each other and then fold one strip back over, then do the same with the other. Keep going until you get to the end. Do the same with the other two strips. You now have two 'springs'. Attach one end to Simon Peter's mother-in-law and the other to her bed. Push down and watch her jump out of bed.

I wonder how she felt before Jesus came to her house? I wonder what she thought when Jesus told her to get up? I wonder if she was glad?

'Band Aid' wrist bands

You will need:

- Colouring sheet
- Scissors

- Pencil crayons
- Sticky tape

Colour and decorate the 'Band Aids'. Cut them out and then on the back write the name of someone you know who is feeling unwell. Use the sticky tape to make these into wrist bands.

You can ask Jesus to be with the person who is feeling unwell and to look after them.

Paper weaving

You will need:

Coloured paper strips

• Sticky tape

Scissors

Lay half of your strips on the plastic you've been using to protect the table. Put them next to each other and tape the ends to the plastic. Now weave the other paper strips under and over the first ones. Use the tape to secure your weaving together and then carefully peel the weaving off the plastic.

Could this be Simon Peter's mother-in-law's blanket? Or, maybe it could be a carrying mat?

In another Bible story a man was carried on a mat by a group of friends so that Jesus can heal him. They couldn't get close to Jesus because of the crowds, but they wouldn't give up. They climbed onto the flat roof and made a hole in it to lower their friend down to Jesus. Jesus healed the man and he picked up his mat and walked home.

You can read this story in the Bible, Luke, chapter 5, verses 17-26.

P Outdoor Activity Suggestions

Ask the adult who is in charge today for some old sheets, blankets or maybe a picnic blanket. Use them to **make a den**.

How does it feel to be inside your den? What sounds can you hear? Can you 'jump up' and serve a tea party in your den? Take the picnic blanket and carry one of your soft toys on it.

How far can you carry it? Can you keep the toy steady in the middle? Is it easier if you ask someone else in your house to help you carry the blanket? Work out a route round your garden. How quickly can you carry the blanket around the route?

Can you **build a bug house** in your garden? Ask the grown up in charge to look up the instructions the link is in their email.
