


# Be Caring Mothering Sunday





There were two Hebrew women named Shiphrah and Puah. They helped other women having babies. The king of Egypt spoke to them. He said, "You are the ones who help the other Hebrew women. Watch them when they get into a sitting position to have their babies. Kill the boys. Let the girls live." But Shiphrah and Puah had respect for God. #### Paper cup basket weaving

You will need:

- A paper cup (or paper plate)
- Wool, ribbons, coloured thread

scissors

Cut your paper cup into 9 even strips from the rim to the base. Take you first piece of wool, ribbon or thread - about as long as your arms. Tie it to the bottom of one of the strips on the cup. Then weave your wool, ribbons or thread in and out of the strips that you have cut into your cup. Go round and round until you've used up all this piece. Now choose a different colour to make patterns. Keep pushing your weaving down the cup so that it holds everything together and covers the cup completely.

Loving God,


Thank you for all the people who love us, look after us and keep us safe. On Mothering Sunday, thank you for mums and grannies, big sisters, aunties and family friends.
