For the first time in some 16 years, (or so I am told), the Circuit has no outstanding property to sell. Since writing to you last, the sale on the old manse in St Matthews Terrace completed on the  $27^{th of}$  March and Ravensworth Chapel was successfully sold at auction on the  $28^{th of}$  March. This is a remarkable achievement ensuring that the Circuit is now in a healthy financial position affording us the opportunity of looking to the future. I cannot thank the Circuit Property Committee enough for all their hard work and dedication including those who have served on this small but important committee in the past.

Part of the reason for selling all the empty Circuit property is to resource ministry and mission, and therefore I am delighted to tell you that the Circuit has successfully advertised for and recruited a Methodist Primary Schools Chaplain, on a five-year contract, who will start in post on the 4<sup>th of</sup> September. This is an exciting new appointment as we say 'goodbye' to Rachel Pinkney who has done an amazing job as the Circuit Schools and Families worker. Please do pray for our new Schools Chaplain, and also pray for Rachel as she takes up her new post as a Probationary Presbyter in the Bishop Auckland & Shildon Circuit.
